

CATAPULT Energy Systems

An innovative service that finds people with health conditions made worse by the cold and gives them immediate, effective support by providing what they need to keep their home at a warm, healthy temperature.

The Catapult have been developing and trialing Warm Home Prescription since 2019



2022-2024:

Catapult ran the first large scale trial across **England and Scotland** reaching over 800 homes with 4 NHS partners

2024-26: Catapult are delivering two first of its kind trials: with an energy supplier, **ScottishPower**, and with a network, **SGN** to understand how existing funding can deliver health and warmth outcomes






Impacts across housing, health and wellbeing AND carbon reduction









People reported improvement in physical and mental health and wellbeing



NHS data showed evidence of a decrease in primary healthcare use

Recipients value heat more



Having experienced a warm home this past winter, recipients indicated they value a warm home more than before



"I'm old and ill and don't have too many years left so I should make sure to keep myself warm and healthy."




93% recipients indicate they value a warm home more than they did last winter and 94% would heat their home to a healthy temperature all the time if they could afford it.

Impact on health



Recipients' physical and mental health and wellbeing improved since receiving the prescription



79% and **70%**

Recipients reported that WHP had a positive effect on their physical and mental health respectively.



If you are really cold you get down in the dumps and if you're warmer you feel a lot better

Impact on everyday life



Factors that contribute to **people's wellbeing improved** how they were able to live



I was able to move around my home and not just sit in one place with blankets and [a] hot water bottle.





53% spent less time in bed or under blankets



71% were able to spend more on other essentials, such as food



42% indicated they used more of the rooms within their home

Emerging findings suggest a decrease in use of primary healthcare





Recipients reported they'd used the healthcare service less often at the end of the WHP service



Reduction in the proportion of recipients with an out of hours appointment in the winter they received WHP



Smaller increases in GP appointments and prescriptions than you would expect had they not received WHP



I honestly could not have gotten through the winter without it. [...] I would have ended up in hospital poorly.



We could scale it as the momentum already built across the UK



I honestly could not have gotten through the winter without it. [...] I would have ended up in hospital poorly.



The UK government has been supportive of this approach to tackling fuel poverty and health inequalities
